Christian Star Academy School Supply List – 2021-2022

Note: The pictures on all items should be acceptable to the Lord.

Each student needs to bring all of the following items (except those noted by age):

FOUR LARGE BOXES OF TISSUES – We never have enough of these! (Nicer quality makes for less sore noses for frequent users.) If you know your child suffers from allergies, please provide extra tissues. We can go through a box of tissues every couple of days during certain seasons.
☐ LARGE (FAMILY SIZE) PACKAGE OF TABLE NAPKINS PER STUDENT — Each student must use two napkins at every lunch.
BACKPACKS MAY BE USED THIS YEAR – (NOT REQUIRED)
TWO WATER BOTTLES (LEAK-PROOF LID; NO STRAWS); Your child must be able to drink without completely removing the lid. – Please make sure these are made of DURABLE plastic/metal. [Please put your child's name on both. One will be his/her daily water bottle while the other will be stored at the school as a backup.] No recyclable water bottles will be permitted. Sports bottles are good!
ONE PACK OF COPY PAPER PER STUDENT – 500 SHEETS (WE CAN ALWAYS USE EXTRA!)
ONE PACK OF NOTEBOOK PAPER PER STUDENT (AGES 11 AND UP)
TWO PACKS OF LINED NOTECARDS (AGES 8 AND UP)
☐ <u>SIX SINGLE SUBJECT SPIRAL NOTEBOOKS</u> (AGES 11 AND UP) – (COLLEGE OR WIDE RULED; NOT RECYCLED PAPER)
THREE 1.5" THREE RING BINDERS – (AGES 11 AND UP) – Binder should have inside, bottom pockets and sturdy, non-flexible sides.
STICK OR ROLL-ON DEODORANT - (AGES 10 AND UP) — DAILY REQUIREMENT (NO AEROSOLS) Please instruct your child how to properly use their deodorant stick to prevent it from breaking off and littering carpet. Some students tend to leave a trail. A mild body cologne is also permissible and nice, but not in aerosol form.
ONE PAIR OF INEXPENSIVE SNEAKERS – These will be kept at school as inside shoes. (Velcro is great for the younger students. These MUST NOT BE SLIPPERS and it is essential that they are DURABLE and FIT WELL, secured on your child's feet. Croc-like shoes are okay for indoor wear only (with socks), as long as the back straps are used properly. NO GLITTER, PLEASE!)

ATTENTION: PLEASE READ THIS CAREFULLY AND COMPLETELY

APPROPRIATE OUTSIDE SHOES

PLEASE SEND YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL IN SHOES THAT WILL BE APPROPRIATE FOR OUTSIDE USE ON THE EQUIPMENT AND RUNNING AROUND ON THE GRASS, WHICH IS SOMETIMES DAMP AND SLIPPERY.

THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND:

- Shoes should have a good gripping sole for running, are well-fitting, etc.
- Shoes should be easy for the child to put on without assistance
- As per our dress code (no sandals, clogs, cowboy boots, or cleats permitted) No boots of any kind are good for outside play. (See additional note below.)
- Socks must be worn at all times
- Velcro/zipper shoes are a good choice to prevent tripping on those untied shoelaces (There are so many no-tie options available now. Students need to know how to tie, but so much time here at school is wasted on instructing students to tie their shoes. It seems as if some shoelaces these days just refuse to stay tied no matter who ties them! Untied shoelaces dragging on the floor become a real safety issue for your child and others.)

A number of students have been wearing inappropriate footwear for recess. Boots (of any type – snow, rain, or work boots, etc.) should not be worn, except in snowy weather. They are <u>not appropriate</u> for playing outside. Students cannot run freely or safely in them. Please make sure your child understands this important safety rule.

Also, please make sure your child can *easily* and *independently* change into their outside or inside shoes. Some students miss several minutes of their recess or work time just trying to change shoes.

NO ELECTRONIC DEVICES, GUM, OR CANDY ARE ALLOWED ON THE STUDENT. I will gladly either pass an important message on to your child or let you talk with him/her. Call my cell phone for this and all other messages for your child or me. (740) 398-2721

PHONES WILL BE TURNED OFF AND KEPT IN YOUR CHILD'S MAILBOX/CUBBY.

Phones are not to be kept in the basement or in any other location.

ANTIBACTERIAL LIQUID HAND SOAP REFILLS – (Note: We have plenty of dispensers!)
<u>DRAWSTRING KITCHEN TRASH BAGS</u> – Quality, strong trash bags needed; scented trash bags are nice.
